

PAY SCHEDULE FOR FY 2009-2010

SUMMER AND EXTENDED DAY/WEEK PROGRAMS

School administrators may not receive compensation for planning for extended day/year programs. The salary schedule below reflects compensation for days worked outside of the administrative contract. Professional employees will only be paid 8 hours per day for any day worked.

\$288 daily rate for an 8 hour day or \$36/hour

High School Records and Scheduling – Summer School

\$22/hour for a maximum of 80 hours

High School Counselor – Summer School

\$22/hour for a maximum of 80 hours

STAFF DEVELOPMENT FOR SUMMER AND EXTENDED
DAY/WEEK PROGRAMS

When teachers/staff are paid to attend training or staff meeting in the district, the rate of pay is \$7/hour. Staff may not be paid to attend out of district conferences/meetings.

When teachers/staff are paid for the expertise in a subject, such as curriculum writing or presenting to others, or to plan for lessons for students, the rate of pay is \$20/hour.

TUTORING

Certified teachers - \$20/hour

Non-certified, bachelor's degree - \$15/hour

College or high school students - \$10/hour

TEACHING AN EXTRA CLASS DURING A CONFERENCE PERIOD

Teacher would be paid 1/6 of a beginning teacher's salary pro-rated for the number of days (of 177) the class is picked up. The funds would come from a district salary fund if there is a vacant position, or if student enrollment justifies an extra class but not an additional teacher FTE. If the campus chooses to lower class sizes, the funds would come from the campus.
